

2022 Scholarship Ceremony

On May 23, we held our 2022 Scholarship Ceremony IN PERSON for the first time since 2019. A full contingency of students, their families, and valued donors attended this event to recognize our scholarship winners for this current school year of 2022-23.

The Foundation is very pleased to announce that a number of new scholarships have been established this year:

The Mary Trackett Reynolds Memorial Scholarship was created by Bruce Reynolds and his family to recognize the life and accomplishments of his mother, Mary Trackett. Mary was born in 1913, into a Washington County family that had hewed out a quarter-section farm in 1861. Her father died when she was one, leaving Mary and her mother in difficult financial straits. But they never sold the 40-acre portion of the farm that she inherited at 17. Instead, through sheer effort, ability, and persistence, she earned scholarships to Madison, Radcliffe, and Columbia University. At Madison she was Phi Beta Kappa. Her Columbia political science PhD was the first ever awarded to a woman. She became a world authority on James Joyce, and taught courses on Joyce at Yale.

This \$20,000 scholarship is awarded to an outstanding female student who has completed her second year at UWM--WC and is continuing on to complete her degree at a 4-year nonprofit university.

The **Gary Britton STEM Scholarship** was created this year by Gary Britton – math professor and former UWWC faculty member. This scholarship is presented to a student who will pursue a career in a STEM field. Gary increased his scholarship to \$2,000 for 2023-2024.

Nancy Van Vooren established the **Vern and Nancy Van Vooren Scholarship**. This very unique scholarship was created specifically to support students who have been in foster care during some part of their high school years. Nancy's motivation is to support students who otherwise wouldn't have a family structure for support as the foster child enters college. To be eligible, students must have been a foster child for at least six months from the age of 16 or older. Students must maintain at least part time status during the scholarship year and attend the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee at Washington County campus.

UWWC alum, Curt Enderle created the **Brad Ford "Rex Wonder" Continue Doing Theater Scholarship** this year for students who are pursuing a degree in Theater or Theater Arts or a related Film or Animation field. Curt named his scholarship after UWWC Professor Brad Ford who had a significant impact on his education and his future career in theater production.

This *IS* our mission in action.

Since 1976 when the Washington County Campus Foundation was founded, we have been able to help thousands of students achieve their goal of earning a college degree. Most of our current scholarships are the result of the generosity of donors, like you, who wanted to create a legacy and help students into their future.


